The Coralville Public Library champions every person's right to information and resources.

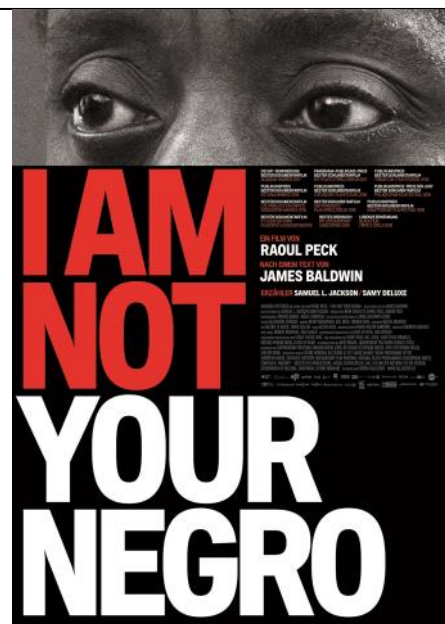
## MLK DAY MOVIE
