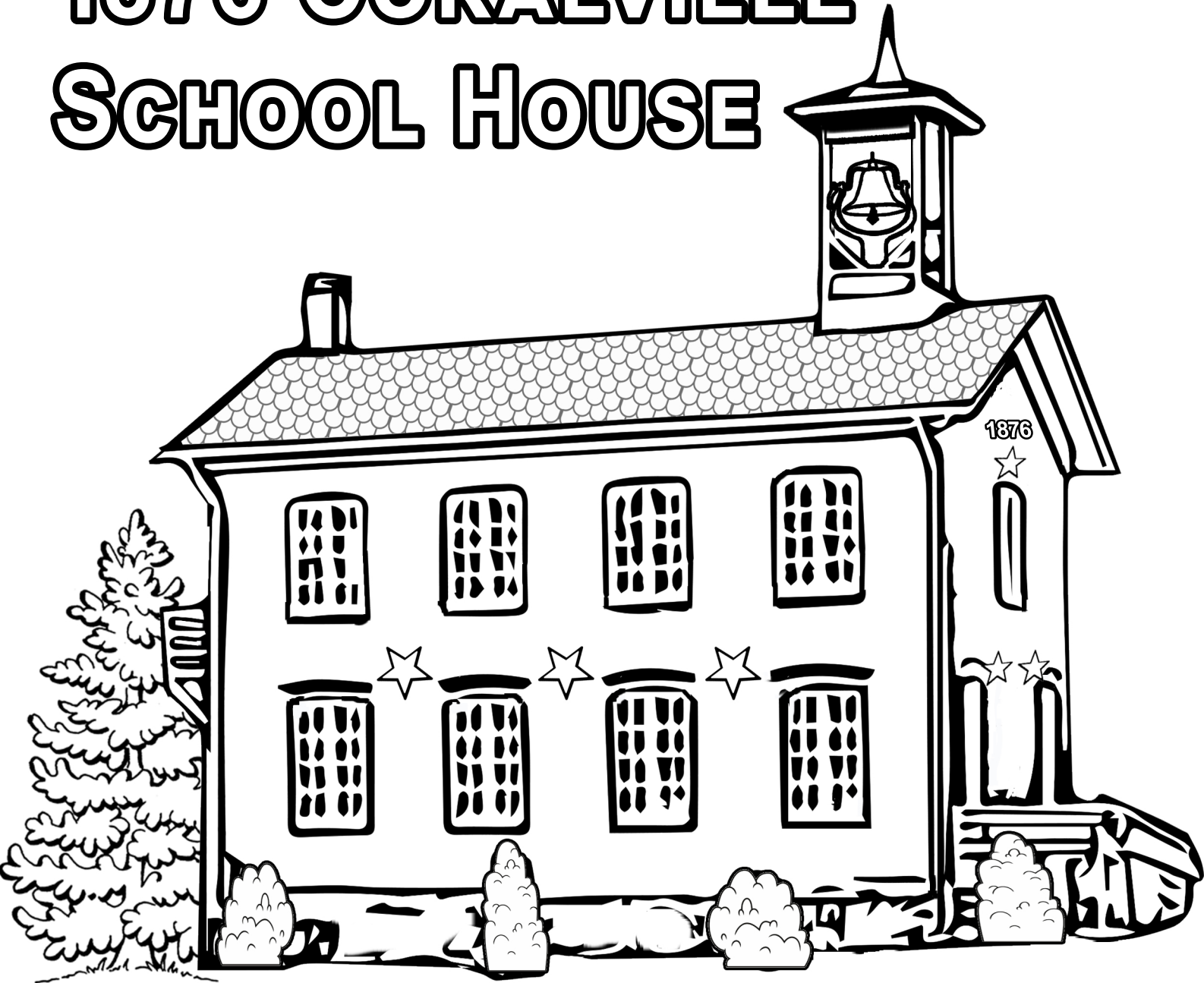


# 1876 CORALVILLE SCHOOL HOUSE



In 1876, the Ezekiel Clark family donated land to the town of Coralville for a school. The two-story brick building boasts native limestone foundation and cast iron star clamps.

Classes were originally held on the first floor, with the second floor being used as the gymnasium and auditorium. As the population increased, both floors were used as classrooms. The schoolhouse ceased all classroom operations in 1951.
