- ♦ Having the members only preview sale on Thursday evening.
- The use of expanded space (previously the sale floor was limited to the Friend's room and meeting room A & B). Now Schwab and the fountain area are also part of the sale area.
- Sorting into more categories and often by author make it easier to locate books of interest. Several board members have worked diligently to improve organization and presentation of book sale offerings.
- Donations instead of set prices. We have been pleasantly surprised by our community's continued generosity.
- The high-quality of donations received that can then be offered to our book sale patrons.
- ♦ Dedicated volunteers who set up, staff the sale, and clean up. Tear down and clean up usually takes less than 40 minutes. Many hands . . .

You will learn about the programs the Friends are sponsoring, new happenings at the library, and witness numerous volunteers receiving recognition awards. 

Since the program was launched two years ago, 8,802 books have been mailed to Coralville children under 5 years oldgiving the gift of literacy to young children in Coralville and rural Johnson County.

Summer Reading is right around the corner! This year's theme is "Read, Renew, Repeat!" Thanks to your generous support of our summer programming, we can offer awesome incentives for readers and create memorable experiences for children and families.

We are looking forward to hosting a petting zoo at the library

on June 11. Barnyard Discoveries of Iowa City will set up their 28-foot trailer in the parking lot. Families will meet a baby pig, miniature horse, a goat, bunnies, and a sweet cow named Buttercup, among many other animals.

More programs for children will include **music** with Dino O'Dell (popular performer from a few years ago returns), a **magic show** with Mikayla Oz, and a **traveling** touch tank from the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium.

Coralville's year-long celebration of its 150th anniversary was a busy one for the Library (and the City in general), and although we all breathed a deep sigh of relief and satisfaction after the concluding event in October, I think it also left us energized to look toward the future and imagine "what's next."

In November the remodeling work in the west wing of the Library commenced, adding a flexible meeting space for small programs and maker space activities.

We're having a series of kick-off events this spring to introduce the community to the new space, and some new opportunities for learning and exploration. We're refurbishing part of the Reference area for better access and usability.

I hope you'll have the chance to take in one of the spring programs and be sure to keep an eye on the Library website for future Library programs utilizing that space.

We had strong participation in the Summer Reading programs in 2023, as well as our Winter Reading challenges over the holidays and Winter Adult Reading Month in February. A big thanks to the Friends for your generous support of all of these programs; they are at the core of Library programming. We're so grateful for the extra Friends support that helps enhance and amplify our offerings to the community.

I also want to thank the Friends for your support of the Wheat Paste Mural project last summer. As you know, the idea for the Coralville Murals celebrating Coralville's history by featuring historical images from our Digital History Archive was the brainchild of Wendy Stevenson, one of our Library staff members. She and Ellen Alexander worked closely with the artist to organize this complex effort, and along with Annie Craycraft, served on the sesquicentennial planning committees.

The Committees collaborative efforts were recognized with a "Sizzle Award" at the Better Together Excellent in Action Awards Reception held in January. The Wheat Paste Mural Project was highlighted, and we thank the Friends for your contribution to that effort in helping to fund the supplies, the design, and the installation of the murals at the Library. They are still intact and a great tribute to the rich history of the Coralville Public Library.

Thanks again for all that you do. I look forward to seeing you at the Library!
