

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Thank you for making it possible to provide **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library** to children in Coralville and rural Johnson County. Since the program was launched three years ago, more than 14,000 books have been mailed directly to children at their homes. Currently, 500 children under 5 years old are registered and 230 children have graduated. Thank you for giving the gift of literacy to young children in our community!

Preparations have begun for Summer Reading, which kicks off May 28. This year's theme is "Level Up at Your Library!" Thanks to the Friends' ongoing support of our summer programming, we can offer exciting prizes to encourage children and families to participate and special events to bring them into the library.

The fun will begin with a reptile

show on June 2 for the whole family. The first time the Cold-Blooded Redhead visited in 2022, more than a hundred people showed up to see her amazing pets, so we are expecting a great crowd! (photo of kids petting a tortoise) More special events for children will include music with Carole Stephens of Macaroni Soup (photo below from 2019 visit), a "mad science" show from the Grout Museum, and a llama visit with Prairie Patch Farm.

FROM THE DIRECTOR

The very first thing I want to say is Thank You for your ongoing support of the Library. In my 25 plus years as director of the Coralville Public Library, I can't think of a time when your support has been more important. Libraries are facing some challenging legislative actions at the state level and executive actions at the federal level.

Congressionally approved federal funds are in peril; those funds are tied to matching dollars from lowa's legislature, and reach public libraries all across the state through resources and services administered by the State Library. In addition, there have been a flurry of library adverse bills proposed this year at the state level that could undermine local control of public libraries and impede Libraries' abilities to provide unencumbered access to information.

At the same time, we are seeing more and more legislative limitations on the ability of growing municipalities (like Coralville) to collect the tax reve-

nues needed to support the very qualities and amenities fundamental to their economic growth and cultural vitality.

So needless to say, this is a very challenging time for public libraries. We are extremely lucky in Coralville to have a community who values and supports its Library, a supportive City Council and Administration, a well-informed and committed Library Board of Trustees, and a generous and dedicated Friends of the Library group. In addition, the CPL Foundation continues to grow and provide supplemental funding for the Library while planning for future needs.

One of areas that the Friends and Foundation have been able to provide key support for CPL has been through the funding of internships. Expanding the regular staff of the Library is extremely difficult at this time, but bolstering our staffing for intervals of time through short-term internships has been very successful and produc-

tive. We are grateful for your willingness and foresight in funding these opportunities.

Thanks again for all that you do! We are deeply grateful for your steadfast support of Coralville's Public Library.




... and Remembering
