

Join us as we explore Clear Creek Trail and learn about summertime foraging with our friends from the **Prairie States Mushroom Club**.




## An Evening With Author Casey McQuiston: a virtual watch party! Wednesday, August 20th - 6:00 pm




### THE ART THIEF MICHAEL FINKEL

### THE AWAKENING KATE CHOPIN

5:30 - 6:45 pm


Learn the basics of car maintenance without needing to take it to the shop. We will be taught by local staff of **King's Auto Repair**. This event will be held in the Library parking lot.
